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Circle of Water: Talking/Listening Circle

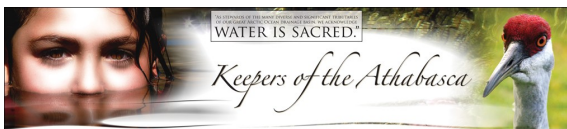

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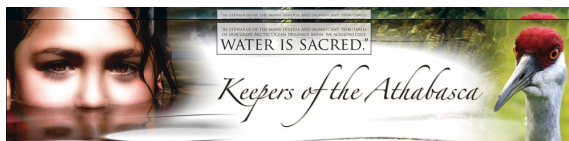
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
